Sermon: Dependence on Repentance

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WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW?

Acts 3:19; 2 Corinthians 7:9-10; Luke 15:11-32

(SERMON IN A SENTENCE) Repentance is a key ingredient in our relationship with God.

Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord. Acts 3:19

WHAT DO I NEED TO ASK?

(Icebreaker) What's one of the best lessons you've learned that came out of a big mistake you made?

What stood out to you from the sermon? How were you challenged?

Read Acts 3:19, 2 Corinthians 7:8-13, and Romans 12:1-2. These verses show that repentance results in a changed mind. Why do you think repentance has become such a foreign concept in today's world? What does repentance look like in your life? How has it impacted you?

How has your mind been changed as a result of your repentance?

Read Ezekiel 14:6, Revelation 2:4-5, and Luke 15:17-24. Repentance leads to a changed mind and will always result in a changed direction. How have you seen the truth of that statement in your life?

What relationships do you need to restore as a result of your repentance? How will you go about restoring those relationships? What's the hardest part of repentance for you?

Consider a time of guided silent prayer: What sin do you need to repent of immediately? What will be your first step to change your heart? Who can you talk to about these to get accountability?
