(SERMON IN A SENTENCE) An everyday faith loves others and gives mercies to all.

MEMORY VERSE

My brothers and sisters, believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ must not show favoritism.

James 2:1

WHAT DO I NEED TO ASK?

- ICEBREAKER: Have each person share one of their favorites—favorite food, TV show growing up, vacation spot, etc.
 - Follow up with: "How do our 'favorites' shape how we treat people? Today, we'll explore James's strong words about favoritism in the church and how love must shape our everyday faith."
 - Before moving into the next question, consider asking someone to read James 2:1-13 out loud for the group.
- What catches your attention most in James 2:1–13? What feels most relevant today?
- 2. Why do you think favoritism was such a critical issue for James to address in the early church? Is it still an issue for us today?

- 3. In what areas of your life do you notice a tendency toward favoritism—either consciously or subconsciously
- 4. How have you experienced being overlooked or honored based on surface-level traits or status? How did that impact you?
- 5. What do you find difficult about giving equal attention or mercy to "the least of these"?
- 6. What might it look like to intentionally withhold favoritism this week?
- 7. Who in your life right now could be described as "the least of these"? How might you intentionally show them mercy and dignity this week?
- 8. What's one next step of obedience you sense God is inviting you to take this week?
